Parking in the Mackenzie District.

This summer you will start to see Council staff monitoring parking around the district. Our new parking bylaw was adopted by the Councillors at their meeting in August and during this first summer we will be taking a largely educational approach.

The areas we are focussing on are reminding people not to park in a mobility area unless they have a valid permit, and keeping an eye on our areas of 'timed' parking. These are the ones where parking is permitted for a fixed



period, like an hour, and where demand means that it's important there is a regular turnover of vehicles and the space is available for others to follow. Council receives the most complaints about these things.

The bylaw also allows us to issue infringements. The details, including the locations of parking zones in our towns, are available from our website at mackenzie.govt.nz > search: parking bylaw.


Resource Recovery Parks






There are two collection trucks picking up different coloured bins which do not always follow the same route. Therefore bins may be emptied at any time during the day, starting from 7:00am.

Watering your garden over summer

Early summer has arrived and recently the weather has started to heat up. Many of us have also started to water our gardens.

There are some watering tips that can help make the most of your water:

- Water your garden in the early morning before the sun heats up.
- Or, water in the evening as things start to cool off.
- Avoid watering during the heat. You risk damaging your plants, and won't get the most benefit.
- Water more deeply and less often. Get the water down into the roots to encourage their growth, and water about 3 times per week.
- Water when your soil is dry for the first 2.5cm

Although it is lovely to have a lush green lawn, it does take a lot of water to maintain. If you can, concentrate your watering efforts on other parts of the garden.

If hot dry conditions continue over the summer we may have to introduce water restrictions. Keep an eye on Council's messaging (our website will always be updated, and we will put posts on our Facebook page and in newsletters) and on the water restriction boards in our towns.



Creative Communities Scheme

The Creative Communities Fund supports and encourages arts activities within the Mackenzie District.


Under the scheme 'the arts' are broadly defined as 'all forms of creative and interpretive expression'.

This includes creative participation in dance, performance, visual arts, music, arts education, toi Maori, literary workshops, digital storytelling and more.

The Creative Communities Scheme is a partnership between Creative New Zealand (the national arts development agency) and local councils in New

Zealand. Each council takes responsibility for delivering the scheme in its area. Local decision-making is the key to the scheme: applications are considered by assessment committees with knowledge and experience of the arts in their area.
