managed and that the potential effects of light pollution on night sky darkness are
managed in the same way throughout the District. 2. Extend the rules to cover light spill
from interior lighting, particularly skylights. 3. Update the rules, in line with advice
received from Canterbury University, to better manage things like security lighting and
to bring the controls up to date in relation to LED lighting. The MDC to also consider
including light spill limits across the district, consistent with other plans, to better
address nuisance effects on residential amenity from light spill between properties.
Increase the level of control on lighting, including introducing controls in areas within
the district that currently do not have any.
